


Our School Middle Schools with Students Like Ours Middle schools statewide





REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2011-2012 has been one of new endeavors and great successes. In an effort to better meet the academic and developmental needs of our students each core content department met last summer to analyze their curriculum based on individual student need and ability. As a result we have developed essentials, full standard, and honors level classes in ELA, and math. This year we also developed nonfiction science and social studies classes that engage students in standards based content while strengthening their reading skills. Throughout the year we have relied heavily on placement tests and MAP data to determine the best classes for every student.

Throughout the year the teachers at Northwoods engaged in professional development that targeted the Mastery Teaching Model, student engagement, and Action-Based learning. Our teachers meet weekly to strategically plan engaging, meaningful lessons for our students in addition to monthly department and CORE meetings. Teachers also review student data at scheduled intervals throughout the year with the principal.

This year we have also tried to improve home-school relations through the revival of our PTSA. The PTSA Executive Board has done a stellar job in reaching out to parents in addition to planning a course of action for the 2012-2013 school year. This year we also implemented mandatory report card pick up nights each quarter. This initiative has been both well-received and attended by our parents. It allows parents to meet with teachers and have student progress conferences with teachers on a quarterly basis.

Northwoods continues to provide a variety of academic and non-academic activities and clubs. Teachers at Northwoods provided after school tutoring and PASS preparation activities for targeted groups of students. In addition to this, our students this year continued to participate in CLASSY Ladies and ARMS programs. This year we also had a very successful football season in addition to our basketball team bringing home the championship trophy for the middle school recreational league! Not only have our students excelled in sports activities, but in the fine arts as well. This year there were several successful band and drama performances.

Much of the hard work and accomplishments of this year were recognized when our school underwent the CCSD annual School Quality Review process last November. The review garnered an "Applying" rating in three of the four strategic priorities for schools in the district. The SQR team gave the school an Innovating rating in our implementation of our Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports system.

Northwoods remains committed to making decisions that we believe will move our school closer to a "Met Standard" school. We are confident that our students are capable of achieving high academic levels if provided with the tools and time necessary for success. We are committed to making our vision of student success a reality.
