
Our School Middle Schools with Students Like Ours Middle schools statewide






READING – GRADE 8 (2011)

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Ellore Elementary International Baccalaureate (IB) Candidate School serves students of child development age through 8th grade. Ninety-eight percent (98%) of our students receive free or reduced meals. The 2011-2012 goals that were implemented are those reflected in our most recent School Renewal Plan for grades CD-8th and the Palmetto Priority School Plan for grades 6-8. During the school year, teachers and magnet school coordinators participated in meaningful and on-going professional developments, workshops, other state, local or on-site training opportunities, and community service events. The goals of these trainings and collaborations supported the implementation of our school-wide magnet theme (IB) as well as the improvement of instructional delivery for all students in grades CD-8 in all core content areas and the arts to include, visual and performing. Two foreign languages, Spanish and French, were supported through direct instruction and a language lab supported by Rosetta Stone.

We continued the use of innovative materials and resources to support increased student achievement on the subtests of PASS in ELA, math, science, and social studies. We also enhanced instruction by continuing to utilize the district-wide literacy program, SIPPS (Systematic Instruction in Phoneme Awareness, Phonics and Sight Words Program) and Making Meaning Reading Comprehension. This literacy initiative continues to ensure that every student becomes a fluent and proficient reader. Additionally, Early Bird Tutoring was provided to students in grades 3-8 and Saturday Academy was provided to students in grades 3-5. Interactive whiteboards were installed in selected classrooms, while every classroom in grades CD-8 and offices received updated computers. Elementary grades continued using Math Out of the Box during math instruction. Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) and ENI benchmark testing were used to study strengths and weaknesses of students in grades 3-8. Moreover, several academic incentives to include, awards programs, fieldtrips and grade level celebrations were provided to students in all grades to support high student achievement targets during the school year.

Through collaborative efforts among school, home, and community, partnerships were established to create a positive, nurturing learning environment that fosters high expectations for all of our students. Our school's motto, "Excellence Without Excuse", means we strive for a high level of academic success for all of our students.
