



REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

It was a great year of growth for everyone at Goose Creek Primary. Not only did we enroll more students than the previous year, but our students also demonstrated excellent growth on the MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) test and continued to grow as Common Core State Standards for Math were implemented school-wide. Our teachers grew as professionals as they sharpened their skills at developing and refining student assessments while working collaboratively in Professional Learning Teams. Support for our teachers also grew as we were able to add a math instructional coach. Through the use of additional part-time interventionists our students received small group assistance that strengthened their reading accuracy, fluency and comprehension.

For the fifth consecutive year Goose Creek Primary held the honor of being a Distinguished Arts Program (DAP) school. Participation in the DAP grant afforded our students a variety of opportunities to increase their exposure to the arts and provided additional training for our teachers. An Anti-bullying themed puppet show taught our first graders how to recognize and prevent bullying behavior. This experience reinforced our "Don't be a Bully" campaign. An artist-in-residence taught students how to work and mold clay into decorative pots.

This year Goose Creek Primary was awarded the ASCA School Counseling Award for being a recognized American School Counseling Association Model Program. Goose Creek Primary is proud to be a Red Carpet School as well as SC Department of Education "Banner" school for PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention Supports). The Fourth Annual Principal's Pajama Party was held in the spring for over 460 students who were able to "buy" a ticket with their Otter Bucks. Teachers, parents and students participated in the first "Stuff the Bus" campaign to kick off the 2011-12 school year as part of our commitment to community engagement. Family Nights featured published authors, make-it and take-it workshops and presentations about our curriculum and standards. The first Goose Creek Primary Chorus was formed and we were so proud of our "Singing Otters" as they performed for the student body, parents and community.

Throughout the year we continued to strengthen our commitment to providing additional opportunities for inclusion for our students with special needs. In the spring our students enjoyed an array of activities during our Fourth Annual Young Athlete's Day. Through a United Day of Caring project with Santee Cooper we were able to create an adaptive garden. Activities in the garden promoted social interaction, environmental awareness, and helped our students develop life-long skills of respect, cooperation and tolerance.

Our PTO and School Improvement Council were instrumental in developing our annual school renewal plan. We sincerely appreciate our volunteers and dedicated parents for helping us make GCP such a great place to learn.
