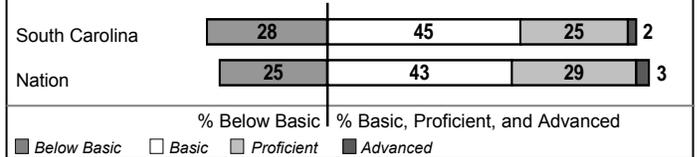

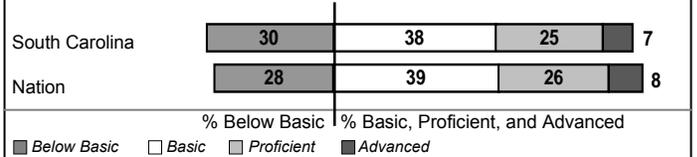

REPORT OF DIRECTOR AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

J. Harley Bonds Career Center is located in the J. Harley Bonds Educational Resource Center at 505 North Main Street in Greer. The center recently completed enlarged and updated labs and classrooms for health science, welding, and machine tool technology. Bonds is truly a special place to learn for the students from Blue Ridge, Eastside, Greer, Riverside, and Wade Hampton High Schools.

Each program is led by a local advisory committee made up of the teacher(s), another staff member and leaders from business and industry. Each committee meets at least two times per year to review the progress of the program and to chart the path of the course for the future. The School Improvement Council is active and plays a major role in developing long range and short range plans for the center. This year the council has focused on making the community aware of what is available and what is happening at Bonds.

All courses are either nationally certified, carry dual credit from Greenville Tech, and/or other colleges such as Johnson and Wales University. Culinary Arts is certified by the American Culinary Federation, Health Science by the American Heart Association, Pharmacy Technology, Automotive Technology by NATEF, Construction Technology and Welding by NCCER, Web Design, and Computer Repair by CompTia A+. Mechatronics, Culinary Arts, Building Construction, Machine Tool Technology, Auto Technology, and Welding provide college credits as well as high school units for students. Auto Technology also is an AYES national training site.

All students belong to their professional organizations and actively participate at the local, district, state, and national levels. For the 7th year in a row, all students have been members of SkillsUSA, HOSA, or FFA. Ten students participated in SkillsUSA nationally after winning the state contests in plumbing, metal fabrication, welding, cosmetology, nursing skills, medical math, and medical terminology. One student served as state president for South Carolina SkillsUSA for 2012-2013. Three teachers are serving on the National Education Team for SkillsUSA. Martha Fayssoux is School Improvement Council chairperson and Wayne Rhodes is the Director.
