Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



District Superintendent's Report

Anderson School District One has continued to maintain the district motto of "A Tradition of Excellence". 2012 – 2013 was another outstanding year for students, teachers and administrators. Anderson One once again received an Excellent report card rating from the state based on test score gains. Eleven schools earned Excellent report cards and two earned Good. Anderson One schools received 10 Gold awards for general performance and one Silver award for general performance from the SC Department of Education. Two schools earned Gold for general performance and closing the achievement gap. Three other schools earned Gold for general performance and Silver for closing the gap. Two schools are ineligible for awards. Program improvement is a critical part of our success. Professional Learning Communities at our schools have created a culture of collaboration, more data analysis, reflection and action. Changes taking place in curriculum and instruction have resulted in a balanced literacy program for K – 5, interventions for K – 12 that are having a great impact on student achievement and more professional development for teachers. Additional technology continues to be added to each school. All ELA and Math teachers have been trained on Common Core State Standards with implementation taking place for grade K – 2 in the 2012 – 2013 school year. The district completed the five year building program resulting in renovations at every school facility. Numerous individual school, student and teacher awards were earned during the 2012 – 2013 school year. Some of the highlights were: Wren High School was selected as a national High Schools That Work (HSTW) Platinum High Achievement School; Powdersville High School Band won the 1A state championship; and three teachers were recognized for Social Studies Teachers of Distinction. The School Board of Trustees, Superintendent, and District Administration along with all school employees and students worked closely together to maintain a tradition of excellence. The mission statement for Anderson School District One states our commitment to providing an academically challenging, community-driven, and diverse educational experience based on the individual needs of each student.
