Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



District Superintendent's Report

This has been another school year of great student achievement and academic excellence. KCSD received a "B" from the SC Department of Education, indicating our "performance exceeds the state's expectations" as a part of a new federal accountability rating system. Five Title I schools—Baron DeKalb Elementary, Bethune Elementary, Blaney Elementary, Midway Elementary and Mt. Pisgah Elementary—were honored as Reward Schools for Performance. Ninety-five percent of the Absolute ratings for our schools' state report cards were Excellent, Good or Average. Thirteen schools—ATEC, Baron DeKalb Elementary, Bethune Elementary, Blaney Elementary, Camden Elementary, Camden Middle, Doby's Mill Elementary, Lugoff Elementary, Lugoff-Elgin High, Lugoff-Elgin Middle, Stover Middle, North Central Middle, and Pine Tree Hill Elementary—were recognized in the Palmetto Gold and Silver program for academic achievement and closing achievement gaps. Pine Tree Hill Elementary was one of only 15 schools statewide to receive silver awards for general performance and closing the achievement gap. Thirty-one KCSD students scored the highest possible score on PASS tests. Sixteen more KCSD teachers earned National Board certification or recertification, bringing the total number of teachers who are National Board certified to 125 or 18 percent of our teaching staff.

The district's performance received statewide and national recognition at all levels. Lugoff-Elgin Middle was the first SC school to be recertified twice as a "School to Watch." Blaney Elementary's SIC was one of nine named to the SC School Improvement Council's 2013 Honor Roll. The Blaney Elementary and Stover Middle archery teams both won the state National Archery in Schools competition. The KC Robotics team was ranked 9th out of 65 teams overall in the FIRST® First Robotics Competition in Myrtle Beach. KCSD's website and four photographs were winners in the SC chapter of the National School Public Relations Association's 2013 Rewards for Excellence. Doby's Mill Elementary was one of 29 schools and districts across the country to be named a 2013 National School of Character. Camden High's newspaper The Palmetto Leaf received a Class I award from the SC Scholastic Press Association. All ATEC cosmetology graduates passed both sections of the state licensing exams. Three ATEC students swept medal honors in the SC Skills USA computer maintenance technology competition. Sixty-six persons—twice the number from the previous year—received their GEDs or high school diplomas from our adult education program. The overall graduation rate of the district improved to 87.4%; in 2007, it was 72.7%.

KCSD completed Phase I of the Facilities Equalization Program. Because of excellent financial and construction management, 13 projects beyond what was originally planned were completed, including a new Jackson School, an addition to Blaney Elementary and multi-purpose rooms at Stover Middle and North Central Middle. KCSD continued to garner national attention for the programs implemented through a \$5.7 million "Safe Schools/Healthy Students" grant. KCSD again received "unqualified opinions"—the top results possible—during its annual financial audit. The district's continued strong financial performance led to the improved outlook on its bond rating.
