

## District Superintendent's Report

In 2012-2013, Clover School District continued to reach its strategic goals and objectives and to provide each child with excellent academic, athletic and extra-curricular opportunities. The district began the year with eight schools earning an "A" and one school earning a "B" on the new Federal Report Card. Additionally, eight of nine schools earned an "Excellent" absolute rating and "Excellent" improvement rating on the State Report Card. With these strong performances, eight schools proudly received state Palmetto Gold or Silver Awards.

The graduation rate in Clover continued its steady climb moving from 77.3 percent in 2011 to 84.4% in 2012. This year, Clover High School graduated its largest senior class in history with 471 seniors. These students earned over 10 million dollars in scholarships, shattering the record set by the previous class by over 4 million dollars. The district's advanced placement program and Middle College also saw tremendous increases in student participation. In 2012-13, 218 honor students took over 289 Advanced Placement exams and 13 seniors who attended the Western York County Middle College, a partnership established with York School District and York Technical College, earned 254 hours of college credit while in high school.

The district has continued its steady pace to implement Common Core State Standards. Grades K-2 and Algebra 1 in the middle and high schools began teaching the new standards fully in 2012-13, while grades 3-8 taught the SC state standards along with several "gap units" to help students with new standards they will need for common core next year. The district hired six new elementary technology instructors to begin teaching K-5 students keyboarding, research, word processing, Power Point, and Excel. These technology skills will be needed as students prepare for online Smarter-Balanced testing in 2014-2015.

The district also upgraded all schools with new security cameras to booster its safety protocols and wireless overlays so that all students and teachers can use technology seamlessly. The schools in Clover had over 1200 iPads in circulation along with laptop carts and several computer labs to integrate technology into classroom instruction daily. The district will add an additional 800 devices in 2013-14, which will facilitate the implementation of a pilot project called "Connected Classrooms". Thirty teachers and approximately 800 students will pilot a one-to-one technology environment during the next school year. In the elementary and middle schools, the "connected classrooms" will have iPads for every student. At Clover High School, "connected" students will have Microsoft tablets. The district plans to be one-to-one for all students in 2014-2015.
