



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Spartanburg School District Four continued to provide opportunities for students to excel during the 2012-2013 school year. And students responded with academic performances that resulted in state and national recognition. The Washington Post ranked Woodruff High School as the 7th Most Challenging High School in South Carolina. This ranking was based on the rigor of the curriculum that is offered to students in the schools. Nationally, Woodruff High School ranked above 93% of all public high schools in the United States. US News and World Report placed Woodruff High School as the 18th best among the 226 public high schools in South Carolina. This designation is based on a school's effectiveness in preparing students for college and career success, as measured by student performance in rigorous courses and overall academic performance.

All of the district's eligible schools were recognized in the state's Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards program. Woodruff Elementary School earned a Gold award for overall student achievement and a Silver award for closing the achievement gap for historically underperforming groups of students. Woodruff Middle School earned a Silver award for closing the achievement gap. While Woodruff Primary School is ineligible for the Gold and Silver awards due to the absence of state-mandated testing at that level, it continues to provide the only public school early childhood program accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children in South Carolina.

Spartanburg School District Four benefits from a supportive community that is represented by an engaged and highly competent School Board. All students attend school in well-maintained and well-equipped facilities. The district's faculty and staff are dedicated to excellence in teaching and service to our students, families and the entire community. A strong sense of pride, loyalty and tradition fosters an atmosphere of camaraderie that makes all this possible.
