**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Marlins ROCK is more than a motto for our students. It is a belief that is held in the hearts and minds of our school family. We are Responsible educators who strive to create an Organized environment that models Character and values Knowledge. Our teachers, staff and parents strive to create an atmosphere that builds community and sets high standards that encourage our students to push their limits and exceed beyond expectations. We are honored to have been named a Palmetto's Finest School in the spring of 2011.

Our beautiful, nautical-themed facility opened its doors in 2007 with 842 students, and we currently serve 1045 Child Development through 5th grade students. We are located in a rapidly developing area of Dorchester County.

The message of TEAM is communicated daily throughout the system. Our principal and teachers host back to school nights and events for all grade levels. On curriculum night, staff share with parents and students expectations/standards for learning for the upcoming year and solicit support in meeting our goals. Monthly meetings of PTA, SIC, student council, grade representatives/leadership team, and PBIS leadership team help to drive the mission and vision of Reeves. Monthly data meetings are held to review the most up to date data for each grade level. The philosophies of the school community and the vision for the school are shared and shaped through collaborative team meetings.

We have technologically up-to-date computer labs that are utilized by teachers and students on a regular basis to develop PowerPoint programs, to conduct research, to work in their individual learning portfolios within the Compass program, and to develop computer literacy skills. Each class has iPads, SMART board (interactive whiteboard), wireless headsets, an LCD projector, and a set of Senteo clickers, and most have computers to enhance instruction and learning.

Our school has met all AYP objectives in the past several years. We have received a Palmetto Gold Award for student achievement. We are excited to see our kids learn and grow and we will continue to create an environment that is safe and happy and that sets the stage for learning.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
