**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



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**Report of Principal and School Improvement Council**

Brown's Ferry Elementary School is a small neighborhood school rich in tradition and heritage. Brown's Ferry's mission is to prepare and challenge our students to succeed as independent learners in today's society. The Brown's Ferry community, staff, and students are proud of their accomplishments and are committed to the belief that all children can be successful in school.

Brown's Ferry's goal is to ensure that students demonstrate competency in the core academic areas and exhibit the qualities of respectful, responsible, and productive members of society. Academic excellence and student engagement continue to be the focus of Brown's Ferry Elementary School. MAP, standardized test results, computer assisted instruction results, and running records are some of the information used to provide targeted instruction for individual students. In addition, remediation and enrichment are provided through use of a daily morning intervention block, flexible grouping, and focus groups.

During the 2012-13 school year, our teachers participated in district-wide collaboration sessions, vertical planning at the school level, and other professional development specific to teacher needs. Our teachers study areas of need and interest and collaborate effectively with their colleagues. We will continue to assess our strengths and weaknesses for school improvement. Brown's Ferry will also set new goals for improved student performance and focus attention on student achievement, teacher quality, parental involvement, and character education.

While academics are our focus, special programs and initiatives beyond the classroom are available through other avenues such as art contests, music programs, Special Olympics and the community recreation department's sports programs. Character education is an important part of our school with administrators and teachers emphasizing the school's expectations daily. Students are recognized for their efforts, excellence, and positive behavior.

A dedicated and involved PTO and SIC continue to provide leadership and vision in the quest for excellence at our school. With the assistance of the PTO and SIC, our school community has the opportunity to participate in Family Curriculum Nights, Title I Parenting programs, Holiday programs, and other activities/events.

As we move forward, the school and community remain committed to the success of all students served at Brown's Ferry. We truly have a special school environment as the result of home, school, and community "Working in Harmony."

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
