Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Pineview Elementary in Lexington Two is dedicated to our mission of developing confident, lifelong learners who will be college or career ready. We serve a diverse learning community of 638 students. Our community plays an active and supportive role in our students' success. We have a strong School Improvement Council (SIC) and Parent Teacher Association (PTA) focused on the needs of our learning community and continuous improvement. The SIC was an asset in preparing for our AdvancED accreditation visit, monitoring our five year plan, and publishing our school summary and narrative. The PTA purchased a new sound system for our cafeteria making it possible to present high quality presentations that could be heard and seen using a new LCD projector and ten foot projection screen. A mural was completed in the hallway welcoming visitors and providing directions to classrooms and other locations. During the summer our walking track and sports blacktop was resurfaced to improve its current condition and safety. Numerous other events and projects were sponsored by our PTA.

Our students were challenged academically and provided with extracurricular opportunities. Using the democratic process our Panther mascot was named "Shadow". Service projects included donating can goods, helping families, and money for Moore, OK. Healthy minds, healthy bodies were promoted with weekly fun runs, field day and walk to school day. Pineview Elementary had a triumphant year. PASS scores were up earning us the designation of a Palmetto Gold Award school with an Excellent rating on the State Report Card. Our instructional focus was on Literacy, Common Core State Standards, and Data Teams. As a participant in the state's Literacy Matters Project, we were provided a literacy specialist onsite twice a month. Our goal is to have high progress literacy classrooms where 100% of our students are engaged in reading and writing text 75% of the time. In addition to staff development, we received a \$10,000 grant to purchase books for our school, and sent every student home with eight to nine books to read over the summer and keep or trade the following school year. With the Common Core State Standards approaching full implementation, we are identifying the priority and supporting standards and adjusting the rigor of our content and its delivery to prepare our students for future success. Data Teams were used to monitor our students' progress, identify best practices supported by research, and make good decisions based upon our data.

We attribute these successes and accomplishments to our community of learners, an exceptionally talented and dedicated staff, an active and strong PTA and SIC, along with a dedicated school board, excellent visionary district level leadership, but most of all strong parental and community involvement and support.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
