Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Saluda River Academy for the Arts (SRAA), built in 1954, is a suburban community school that serves 415 students in kindergarten through fifth grade. We are accredited by AdvancED and have held this distinction for the last forty years. This year, the SRAA community (faculty, students, parents, friends, and businesses) participated in an in-depth, rigorous District accreditation self-study, with the goal of making continuous improvement. We have much to celebrate. To date, we have received over \$160,000 in grants from various sources. We were visited by SC Superintendent of Education, Dr. Mick Zais, for our academic achievements. His visit marked the third consecutive State Superintendent (Jim Rex and Inez Tenenbaum) to visit SRAA.

This past year, we utilized a variety of strategies to enhance student achievement by means of increasing student engagement and differentiating instruction. We continued a parallel block schedule in order to create more opportunities for small group instruction across the school. We utilized Habits of Mind—an instructional approach designed to promote thinking and academic excellence within children, regardless of diverse needs. Task rotations were used in several classrooms, as a method of meeting our children's instructional needs. We continued the use of small group instruction, such as in our READ 120 classroom. Mimio (HeadSprout), First In Math, Compass Learning provided computerized ways to differentiate instruction for all students. We expanded our Response to Intervention (RtI) reading initiative to include second graders. Parents and students participated in an evening of shopping at Food Lion in order to apply math skills to a real-world situation. We used a RtI/Title I Facilitator, a part-time Instructional Facilitator, and teachers to assist with on-going, job-embedded professional development regarding instructional strategies and utilizing data to make explicit, student-focused decisions.

Our students were presented with unique opportunities to showcase the school within and outside our neighborhood. Students performed at Sonoco Corporation's corporate headquarters in Hartsville, SC and for Lexington Two's Community Coalition's, Rise Above It meeting at Midland's Technical College.

Our unique Arts program is integrated into the curriculum and is a channel for improving our students' achievement, confidence, and communication. We expose students to the various facets of the Arts while teaching discipline, expression, cooperation, and character. Four artists-in-residents provided instruction for our students in the areas of mime, dance, rhythm composition, and cartooning. We offered after school arts classes and extra-curricular opportunities. We had a before school running club. Our achievements and accolades are a reflection of the strong support from our SIC, PTO, business partners, and community. Saluda River Academy for the Arts proudly remains committed to our mission of "Advancing Every Student." As a team, we endeavor to touch the minds and hearts of all learners by living the mission.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
