

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Brennen Elementary School is a flagship school in Richland School District One. Our school is situated in a residential neighborhood in Columbia. We serve over 800 students, which makes us the largest elementary school in our district. Our student body is diverse, which makes Brennen a wonderful place to be.

Through shared decision making, a positive learning environment, and high expectations, Brennen continues to be an award-winning school. Based on the 2012 state report card, we have maintained a rating of Excellent on the South Carolina School Report Card. New this year is the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), which is federal legislation that promotes student achievement through school and district reform. Brennen's grade based on the ESEA was an A. In addition, our school continues to be awarded the Palmetto Gold Award. Our students receive top-notch instruction from highly qualified teachers on a daily basis.

Our academic success is due to our use of data in our classrooms to drive instruction. Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) give teachers data on their students and data on how instructional needs can be met. Literacy continues to be a district initiative. Our teachers work collaboratively to utilize literacy in all areas of the curriculum including math, science, and social studies. Students who need intervention in reading receive additional instruction during the school day. Students involved in these interventions have demonstrated positive gains as well. In order to help us target students who need intervention, we have implemented AIMSweb. We are able to assess students three times a year as well as progress monitor students weekly and bi-weekly who are in our intervention groups.

Students at Brennen have an opportunity to participate in events that reinforce learning in the classroom. We are proud to offer our students German, Chorus, Action, Cheer, and Tumble, Girls on the Run, and Zumbatonic. Our Student Council is very active and sponsored the following: Bulldogs are the Best Writing Contest, Make a Wish, Spirit Day, and were responsible for facilitating the donation of over 19,000 pounds of non-perishable food to Harvest Hope Food Bank.

Our School Improvement Council (SIC) and Parent-Teacher Organization (PTO) work together collaboratively to provide ongoing support and resources to our children, teachers, and staff. Our PTO's largest fundraiser is our Brennen Auction. This year our auction raised over \$45,000 to help benefit our school. This money will go to the implementation of two-30 station iPad carts. In addition, PTO will fund an additional 30 station iPad cart for each grade level.

Brennen Elementary looks forward to our continued success.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
