**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

At Rice Creek Elementary, our 20th year of teaching and learning has been focused on increasing faculty, student, and parent engagement, and developing and maintaining effective partnerships in order to maximize student learning.

Our faculty currently consists of 13 National Board Certified teachers. One hundred percent of our faculty and staff participated in professional development opportunities throughout the year to develop a deeper understanding of how to better meet the needs of our students in order to maximize their learning potential. Our magnet program, eFIT (The Environmental Fitness Academy), showed continued growth with the eFIT Festival and the 'From the Field Day' which allowed us to connect with our school partners and our community. As a Professional Development School, through a partnership with the University of South Carolina, Rice Creek had 7 student teachers and hosted a math practicum class for 20 college students who are on track to be teachers. Through our Department of Defense grant we hosted two Parent University evenings which allowed us to connect more with all of our stakeholders. It also allowed us to train a group of students and staff through the Child2Child Program, in how to better support all new students and families to Rice Creek Elementary.

This year Rice Creek was recognized by the SC Education Oversight Committee as a Palmetto Gold School for Closing the Achievement Gap. Prior accomplishments for Rice Creek Elementary include being recognized as a Palmetto Silver School for General Performance, National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence, National Blue Ribbon Special Emphasis Award Winner for Technology, Exemplary Writing Award Winner and Hall of Fame Member, two-time Red Carpet Award Winner, and a Flagship School of Promise. These awards and honors are directly related to the hard work and dedication of our students, parents, faculty, staff, and community members. This year our SIC, in conjunction with our PTO, focused on developing a school uniform that was supported by all stakeholders. They also focused on assisting the school in developing deeper relations with our local community. School-wide service projects were sponsored for various needs such as: a Zumba and food drive in partnership with our PTO for Harvest Hope Food Bank, funds through Jump Rope for Heart for the American Heart Association, funds from our faculty in the Breast Cancer Awareness Walk, an entrepreneurial day sale by our Smartwise Club to support the Epworth Children's Home, and a pillow case sale by our Student Council to the Palmetto Health Children's Hospital. Our PTO efforts and support allowed us to enhance the physical environment of our school with murals which connect the hallways with the learning in our classrooms. They also assisted us in improving the number of library books we have available for our students in order to meet their literacy needs. We are extremely proud of our accomplishments at Rice Creek Elementary and know that these are only possible through the support of our parents and community.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
