**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



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**Report of Principal and School Improvement Council**

Orchard Park Elementary School continues the quest for excellence in academics, wellness, citizenship and opportunities for each student. The school family has actively pursued a focus on academic pursuits, enrichment, and the establishment of a positive school culture.

We encourage every student to "Soar High With Pride" at Orchard Park, and we embrace initiatives that foster the development of our 820 pupils with opportunities for growth of the "whole child." Community service is an important endeavor at OPES as evidenced by student collections of food for the Fort Mill Care Center, making cards for members of the armed forces, providing assistance for the local animal shelter, raising money for Jump Rope for Heart and supporting the holiday Angel Tree. Individuals with interest participate in the School Patrol, the Breakfast Club, Lego Robotics, Buzzing with Buddies, Junior Achievement, Biztown, WEE Deliver, golf lessons, Recorder Club, Girls on the Run, Drama Club, the OPES news and the parent led Chess Clubs. The fifth grade continues their partnership with the Westminster Towers Retirement program. Our developmental guidance program emphasizes character traits monthly. Orchard Park is acknowledged as a bronze level winner in the Healthier U S Schools Initiative. Pupil achievement is recognized in the Student of the Month and Math Maniac programs, and the students won our 11th consecutive Palmetto Gold Award. Pupil progress is assessed through PASS tests, Measures of Academic Progress, Accelerated Reader, Fitness Grams, and the Developmental Reading Assessment.

Professional development time has been dedicated to the implementation of Common Core Standards. Teachers also took part in monthly technology workshops. Curriculum Nights brought large numbers of parents to school to learn about Google Docs, reading for meaning, RAZ kids, and the IXL and FASTT Math programs. Our teachers continue as lifelong learners, with 19 currently National Board Certified.

We are grateful for the support of our partners in education: OPES parents, district administrators and school board members, local businesses, community organizations and our very active PTO and School Improvement Council. The PTO purchased 6 security locks for badge entrance which were installed during the summer of 2012. Parents also helped to build 4 raised bed garden spaces. In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
