REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

North Pointe Elementary is the culmination of a building program that has encompassed 18.8 million dollars out of a bond referendum throughout Anderson School District Five. We are located on highway 81N, approximately 3 miles from the city limits of Anderson, South Carolina. Built in 2012 and occupied on August 6th, North Pointe is a two-story facility with 134,038 square feet sitting on almost 37 acres. The school houses 41 classrooms, 12 small tutorial spaces, 5 labs (2 PC, 2 iMac labs, 1 science lab), a full size auditorium, gymnasium, cafeteria and a grand Learning Commons. The school opened its doors in August serving approximately 330 students primarily from two other schools within the district but also held open registration for "school choice" to any student who wished to apply.

Since this is the school's first year in operation, the School Improvement Council along with our PTO worked to gather information and establish a culture with rich traditions. We began our year with a school-wide picnic where we began getting to know each other. Along the way, we elected our first student government. The student body named our school mascot-we are the Panthers. And we held many family friendly activities such as "Milk and Cookies with Santa", Spring Fling and various movie nights. Our staff sponsored afterschool clubs that enriched the lives of our students. We offered a running club, volleyball club, art club and chorus. Plans are already underway through PTO and SIC to expand the offerings and allow a larger participation group this next year.

For posterity's sake, our student council researched and gathered items that exhibited their interest and artifacts that incorporated their "likes" of today to place in our time capsule. The school-wide ceremony took place on May 31st led by our student body president and our school superintendent. The plan is to open the time capsule when the current group of kindergarteners graduates from high school. The year will be 2025.

We administered our first PASS assessment this year. The faculty and staff pulled together to assist all students through morning and afternoon review sessions. We look forward to celebrating the successes our children will obtain and looking for ways to make improvements.
