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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Mary H. Wright Elementary, in collaboration with parents, partners and the school community, strives to provide educational experiences which address the individual learning needs of a child, accelerate academic abilities, build character, and foster a love for the arts. We pride ourselves on the rich history of our school and community. Our parenting liaison, staff, SIC, PTO, faith-based organizations, and business partners provide many opportunities to involve parents in the learning experience; such as Book Character Dress-Up Day, Dr. Seuss Celebration, Pupils and Parents Pick Personal Library, Day with Dads, iLearn with iPads Night, Grandparents Day, and College Colors Day for our families and community. We are supported by The Mary Wright Achievers, AmeriCorps, The City of Spartanburg Parks and Recreation Dept, Neighborhood Associations, local colleges, faith-based organizations, and anonymous providers.

Accepting the challenge to achieve, our faculty worked diligently to provide students with an enriched learning experience. In doing so, the 2012-2013 school year was one of growth and progress. The School Leadership Team, Grade Level Leaders, and Grade Level Teams focused on trending data compiled from Measures of Academic Performance, Benchmarks, Dominic Reading levels, SRA level placements, Fast ForWord and Classworks results, to guide instruction. Every student was provided an iPad2. This 1:1 digital implementation enhanced the academic program by allowing students to research, apply, and present what they are learning. Professional development sessions were scheduled monthly which focused on technology integration and deconstructing the Common Core State Standards. Teachers also attend conferences, workshops, seminars, and graduate courses.

Mary H. Wright provides a myriad of enrichment activities for students, such as The First Tee, Student Council, Safety Patrol, Extended Day, SES, Fast ForWord Camp, Dream Learning Math Camp, "Wee" are Wright Camp, Leadership Camp, Wofford Academy, Stage Performances, Boys and Girls Club, Band and Strings, to support our academic program. Students received nearly 15 books new books for their home library. Our vegetable gardens are maintained by our students. Our guidance program, college-going culture, and positive behavior plan, allow our students to respect uniqueness, diversity, democracy, citizenship and service learning. The school participated in Jump Rope for Heart, March of Dimes, Relay for Life, Pennies for Pasta, and United Way. Student artwork was displayed inside the Chapman Culture Center, Piedmont Interstate Fair and the SC State Fair. Mary H. Wright Elementary was recognized for hosting a successful International Walk to School Day.

Through shared purpose, vision, and commitments, the administration, faculty and staff, parents, and community of partners, recognize the importance of a combined effort of all stakeholders to work collaboratively to provide relevant and rigorous learning experience for our students to reach their personal potential, which reinforced our school: "Moving in the Wright Direction!"
