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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Clover High School is a comprehensive high school serving all students in grades nine through twelve in the Clover School District. CHS continues to grow EOC scores, HSAP first time pass rate, and graduation rate - all of which were all time high's in 2013. For the second year in a row, CHS was awarded Palmetto Gold Award for outstanding test performance and improvement.

Academically, several thresholds were crossed by our students during this school year. Sixteen of our graduates received a SC Academic Honor Award in addition to their SC diploma for exceptional grades and test scores throughout their high school career; twenty-eight students have received Palmetto Fellows, the premier state scholarship to encourage the best and brightest to remain in SC; 113 Clover High Students received life scholarships; 206 students received Hope Scholarships. The total number of graduates eligible to receive a scholarship from the state of SC was 317, more than 65% of our graduating class. The total amount of documented scholarships offered to the class of 2013 was \$10,053,782!

CHS set a higher standard for outstanding performance on college entrance exams with the 2013 graduating class. Eighty-one students scored 1100 or higher on the CR and Math portions of the SAT and thirty-seven students scored a twenty-four or higher on the ACT exam. Their performance earned CHS three Cum Laude of Academic Achievement Awards for SAT and ACT scores and improvement. CHS also had one finalist for the National Merit Scholarship as well as two commended students.

Our Career and Tech Education students placed in several state and national competitions. Our chorus won their eighth state championship in the last eleven years; our band won their fifteenth state OPA award, and our Indoor Drumline finished fourteenth at the Dayton, OH World Championships.

On the playing fields and courts, 82 CHS student-athletes were recognized for either All-Academic, All-Area, All-Region, or All-State selections en-route to region championships and playoff berths. Ten of our athletes signed college scholarships.

We are proud of the accomplishments of Clover High School's students and of the support we receive from our community each and every day.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
