


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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2012-2013 school year furthered the Dreher High School tradition of excellence. Our school was again named as a Palmetto Gold Award Winner, and honored on Newsweek's List of America's Best High Schools. We received an absolute rating of "Excellent" on the South Carolina State Report Card. The S.C. State Department of Education awarded Dreher 2 "Cum Laude" ratings for excellence in SAT AND ACT performance. Dreher proudly served six National Merit Finalist, three National Merit Commended Scholars and a National Achievement Scholar. Seven received merit scholarships. The Class of 2013 boasted thirteen million dollars in scholarship offerings. Six dozen seniors earned Life Scholarship with seventeen recognized as Palmetto Fellows. Eleven outstanding seniors were named AP Scholars with Distinction. Four are AP Scholars with Honor and thirteen were recognized as AP Scholars. Academy graduates include eighteen in Engineering and Science, seventeen in Humanities, and forty-one in Fine Arts. Our students' honors included the prestigious U.S. Presidential Scholar Program, the S. C. Academic Decathlon Championship, first place finishes in state Latin competition and the S.C. Economics Challenge, a 2013 Young Artist Award winner in dance placing among the top 4% of applicants nationwide, the S.C. Thespian Scholarship recipient, twenty-one district orchestra festival participants, five region and three all-state orchestra placements. Twenty-seven Honors Chorus members were named and our new show choir was formed. Sixteen thespians received S.C. Drama Association recognition. Our drama director was named as the Richland County School District One "Teacher of the Year." Twenty-nine instrumentalists were selected as District Honor Band and two musicians received All-State recognition. Dreher experienced another exemplary year in activities and athletics. The Robotics team, Los Pollos Locos, competed in the Palmetto Robotics Regional. Blue Devil Company received the NJROTC's "Unit Achievement" award for Area Six. Two students will compete at the Future Business Leaders of America nationals in June. Our Environmental Club spearheaded our recycling program. Our student government earned the Gold Honor Council Award with two students elected to state level offices. Blue Devils community services included the Walk for Life, the MS Walk, and multiple drives for the Red Cross and Harvest Hope Food Bank.

Cheered on by our spirited Blue Crew, outstanding student athletes include a State 3A champion in the 200 and 400 meters and a 2013 state champion wrestler. Seven will continue their education through collegiate athletics. Our 422 student athletes include 332 letter awards, 53 All-Region athletes, 40 SCHSL Scholars, 9 all-state athletes, 5 North/ South All-stars, and 2 Region V-AAA MVPs.

Our dedicated faculty bolstered all students through exemplary teaching, mentoring, collegial/ HSTW efforts and technology inclusion. These master teachers gave endless hours in preparation, re-teaching and support. An alternative room and credit recovery program added to their efforts. Their expectations and nurturance combine with the support of our parent and community groups such as the PTO, Foundation, SIC and multiple booster clubs to continue Dreher's proud tradition.
