**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



**Report of Principal and School Improvement Council**

The 2012-2013 school year at Sanders Middle was full of excitement. Once again, our academic team won the Tri-County Academic Bowl for the second consecutive year. Also, our school won first place in the State for the Book Awards Banner Contest. The Sanders Yellow Jackets added another Girls' Basketball Championship.

The focus this past year was on measuring and improving growth in Science and Social Studies. We believe that we have made great progress towards achieving our school's vision: Sanders Middle will strive to provide all learners with opportunities to achieve academic and personal excellence. We also celebrated receiving an "A" rating on the State Report Card for the previous school year. We moved from Below Average into the Average category for our overall rating.

Montessori continues to be a strong academic program here at Sanders. Once again, we had 100% of our students to pass the End of Course tests for Algebra 1 Honors and English 1 Honors for high school credit.

Increasing our use of technology continues to be a focus for us. We have added more computers in the classrooms, and our teachers and students have undergone more technology training. We continue to promote life-long learning through reading initiatives that include challenging faculty, staff, and students to gain an appreciation for reading. This year again collectively we have logged over 1 million pages of reading.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
