**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Hemingway M.B. Lee Middle School, located in Hemingway, South Carolina, serves students in grades sixth through eighth. Our motto is "Academic Excellence Is Our Ultimate Goal." Each year, the faculty, staff, and students continue to strive for academic excellence, the ultimate goal.

Many strategies have been used this year to better meet the needs of the individual students. Teachers met weekly in Curriculum Focus Meetings to discuss data, instructional strategies, behavioral issues, and other concerns that would affect the success of their students. To increase students' performance, RIF (Redo Incompletes & Failures) and BEE (Beyond Everyday Expectations) tutoring were implemented this school year. Hemingway M.B. Lee Middle School offers high-quality education for all students with highly qualified teachers. Qualifying students can enroll in high school credit classes, including English 1, Algebra 1 and Keyboarding. The state end-of-course results for 2013 showed that our students in Algebra I had a 94 % passage rate.

Outside of the classroom, our students participate in a number of organizations, clubs, and sports, including Student Council, Marching Band, Academic Challenge, Drama Club, Jr. FBLA, Beta Club, Science Club, and Math Club. Our B-team girls' basketball team won its second straight season championship during the 2012-2013 school year.

The faculty and staff of Hemingway M.B. Lee Middle School are proud of the accomplishments of our students. We are appreciative of the support and partnerships with parents, community members, local businesses, and the school board.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
