

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The team at Baptist Hill has fostered a data-rich environment. No decision about any student is made without a team approach using standardized, norm-referenced and curriculum-based assessments. We use the philosophy of high school response to intervention to universally screen all of our 7th, 8th and 9th grade students and place them in math and/or reading interventions if the data are appropriate for Tier II/III instruction. Through this process we have significantly improved the percentage of our students reading below grade level as well as those who lacked number sense and mathematical foundational skills. For our higher-level students, we offer high school credit in grade 8 in English I and Algebra I as well as a gifted and talented program. Our high school offers honors sections of all our core classes.

We believe our school is a microcosm of the world students will enter upon graduating. Students are held accountable for soft skills including communication, punctuality, respect, effort and accountability. Baptist Hill provides a comprehensive curriculum aimed to give our students the most important gift an institution of higher learning can provide the tools for opportunity and choice in their post-graduate lives. For our scholars, we offer a rigorous curriculum of core classes complemented by opportunities in the arts, technology and career-oriented classes. This year we will increase our post-graduate academy by adding a Barbering Cohort, which will, upon completion, provide our scholars with licensure to provide barbering services in South Carolina. We also offer our students dual high school and college credit opportunities through our partner Trident Technical College, St. Paul's Campus. In January, we will be the only school in the tri-county area to offer a Fire Academy in conjunction with our partner, St. Paul's Fire Department. Upon completion, the cohort will have 25 hours toward their Fire Science Degree.

At Baptist hill, we are proud of our tradition of serving our sea island communities since 1948 and we are looking forward to the next 60 years! We welcome visitors! Come by and check out our innovative programs and amazing staff. EXPECT to be impressed.
