



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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

2012-2013 marked another amazing year at Berkeley Elementary School. As a National School of Character recognized by the Character Education Partnership, the implementation of The Peaceful School Model has shown a significant decline in discipline rates over the past five years while the student attendance rate remains constant at 96%.

Berkeley Elementary School provides an exceptional learning environment. The school again received an excellent rating on its 2012 report card. The child development program is fully licensed by the Department of Social Services. Through an intensive district-wide process the Berkeley County School District, including BES, is now accredited by the AdvancED Accreditation Commission and Board of Trustees by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools on Accreditation and School Improvement. This is an international accreditation organization and the district and BES will remain accredited through June 30, 2016.

Student achievement continues to show growth in many areas. AIMSweb testing demonstrated growth in reading as follows: Kindergarten scores showed that 83% of the students are established in Letter Sound Fluency at the end of the year. First grade Oral Reading Fluency scores show that 88.4% of the students are considered established or some risk. In grade two, 93% of the students are established or some risk in reading fluency. Data from the Measures of Academic Progress assessment indicates that 63.5% of second graders met their target growth in Reading and 56.7% met their target growth in Mathematics. The implementation of the Common Core State Standards along with differentiated instruction and early intervention services are utilized to meet students' individual needs.

Students participate in school and community programs that enhance development and promote citizenship. These programs include Kiwanis "Terrific Kids" character education, Berkeley County Kids Who Care ecology awareness, Maestro Club, and various community art shows. Students receive mentoring from volunteers through our major business partner, Santee Cooper and also through the Berkeley High School Teacher Cadet Program. The second grade Character Council provides student leadership opportunities for school improvement.

Our staff increases their professional knowledge through staff development and coursework. There are nine Nationally Board Certified teachers on staff. Parents are an integral part of the school and serve on the PTO and the School Improvement Council (SIC). The SIC team members meet throughout the school year to review annual goals and make needed changes for improvement.

Berkeley Elementary School fosters an environment of success and appreciation for all students, staff, parents, and community. We will continue to develop partnerships that will ultimately help our students reach their maximum potential.
