**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



**District Superintendent's Report**

In 2013-14, we continued our dedicated efforts to whole child education and to providing the vital 21st Century skills students need for college, careers, and a successful life. Our vision of providing personalized learning and global opportunities was further realized through implementation of standards-based grading at the elementary level, Common Core State Standards in K-12, project-based instruction in K-12, and signature experiences at our elementary schools in the areas of Montessori, global studies, L2- Literacy and Leadership, and STEAM - Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math.

Most notably, all schools and the district posted their highest report card ratings since the report’s inception in 2007, with the District earning Excellent ratings for both performance and growth; only one of 19 in the state. Additionally, on the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) federal accountability results, with higher cut off scores for performance grades District Four schools upheld their ratings of four A’s and two B’s. Five schools in Anderson School District Four were recognized for achieving the Alliance for a Healthier Generation 2014 Bronze National Recognition Award. Earning this distinction were La France Elementary, Pendleton Elementary, Townville Elementary, Riverside Middle, and Pendleton High. Our five schools were among the less than 300 schools across the country to receive this important recognition and the only South Carolina school district to have this number of schools to be recognized in a single year. And in support of our efforts to promote Science Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) education and career paths, the district was awarded a \$25,000 Bosch Community Fund grant.

Outside the classroom, students continued to shine as The Pride of Pendleton Marching Band won the AA State Championship; our FFA program brought home numerous state honors in floriculture, poultry, land and livestock evaluation, Wildlife Management, and Agricultural Mechanics; and in the first year of existence, Riverside’s archery team qualified for the NASP National Tournament by winning the state championship at the SC Archery in the Schools Tournament. In the interest of keeping our children safe and improving service, Anderson Four added air lock entry doors at five locations, emergency preparedness plans were reviewed and updated, and an additional school resource officer was added at the middle and elementary level.

The 2014-2015 school year promises to be exciting as we grow our technology integration and 1:World Design, renew our AdvancEd District Accreditation, and expand our Signature Experiences grounded in Personalize Learning and Global Opportunities for students. We understand that the quality of each child’s life depends on our work. We are committed to expanding our knowledge and skills, as we model lifelong learning and healthy lifestyle choices for students while feeding the intrinsic desire to improve as professionals.
