**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



**District Superintendent's Report**

Williston School District 29 is very grateful for the support received from our five –member Board of Trustees, our teachers, administrators, and staff, as well as our families and community as we focus on student success. We continue to devote our resources to ensuring every student has the opportunity to be successful and have worked to support a lower student/teacher ratio per class than in years prior.

Accomplishments this year include an Excellent report card rating for Williston-Elko High School. This is the second year in a row for that honor. Both the high school and Williston-Elko Middle School received the Palmetto Gold and Silver distinction for academic achievement in closing the achievement gap between disaggregated groups. The award was developed by the Education Oversight Committee (EOC) in 2008. Our high school graduation rate remains high with offerings of credit recovery options that help students in need of additional assistance to stay on track and earn a diploma. Programs such as High Schools That Work, MAP Formative Assessments, Balanced Literacy and Study Island serve to help students achieve academic success.

Our District Strategic Plan is central to the mission of the district based on input from school and community and was updated this year to include a comprehensive technology plan for the future of the district. Technology helps us provide support for our students as they do their work and learn in new ways. Our updates in district policy and funding resources are helping us establish a technology-rich environment using more available personal mobile computing devices in our schools.

Challenges for the year to come include, transitioning from state curriculum standards to a new state test that will not be announced until the fall 2014. Additional struggles for a small district like ours with minimal state funding support is to provide quality programs and keeping a strong graduation rate. Also, our Board of Trustees is committed to providing quality facilities that will meet the needs for the future of our district and quality of education for years to come.
