

**District Superintendent's Report**

The School District of Newberry County continues to enjoy many successes. Serving over 6,000 students, the district has 12 schools and a technologically advanced career center. The district’s 2013 South Carolina School Report Card ratings of Excellent for absolute and Excellent for growth were its best ratings yet. Little Mountain Elementary, Pomaria-Garmany Elementary, Mid-Carolina High, and Newberry High all received Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards for General Performance. Little Mountain Elementary and Newberry High also received a Palmetto Gold and Silver Award for Closing the Achievement Gap. Pomaria-Garmany Elementary School was the only state school for 2013-2014 that was eligible for the state’s Flexibility through Deregulation Program, based on student subgroup achievement, Palmetto Gold and Silver status, and accreditation over the previous three years.

Our successes are achieved through the efforts and commitments of our dedicated trustees, teachers, support staff, and administrators. Professional development, led by district staff, focused on meeting state standards and student engagement. We are also continuing a formal STEM initiative and are adding multiple STEM offerings to include an exciting biomedical engineering program. We continue to serve our students by offering varied opportunities to ensure success and life-long learning. Three of our elementary schools continue to offer Montessori programs for students age 3 through grade 5. Our high schools and career center continue to expand curricular offerings to meet the needs of our students. The district’s alternative program for middle and high school students continues to be modified to better serve our students and return the students back to their original schools.

The support and involvement from our families and community are an integral part of our continued growth. Our partnerships extend beyond our classrooms and our collaborative efforts positively impact our community. We are thankful for that support and ask for continued involvement within our school district so that we may continue to provide the best educational experience for students in Newberry County.
