



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REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

The 2013-2014 school year has been one of extraordinary achievements and innovative academic programming for Dorchester School District Two. Recognized as a school system of excellence, the school district and all schools have been awarded National Accreditation from the AdvancED Accreditation Commission. As a result of outstanding student growth and achievement, the district earned an absolute rating of Excellent and a growth rating of Excellent on the 2013 state report card. Seventeen of the twenty-one district schools received an absolute rating of Excellent and the other four schools received a rating of Good. In addition, Dorchester School District Two was one of only a few districts in the state that received an A on federal ratings released this year.

Working collaboratively with local colleges, businesses and chambers of commerce, the district has focused on increasing college career readiness initiatives that have created new opportunities for students. This year students were offered expanded Early College and Dual Credit programs that have allowed them to earn both high school and college credits. In order to prepare all students for a successful entry into the workforce, ACT's WorkKeys assessments were administered to all high school juniors and seniors, with the goal that all students will graduate with a WorkKeys certificate of skills mastery in addition to a diploma. Of the 1,416 seniors tested, 95% earned a WorkKeys certificate that objectively determines their work-ready status. Through robust partnerships with local industries and institutions of higher learning, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) programs have been expanded dramatically at every level.

District schools and students continue to excel in all areas of academic and extracurricular activities. Seventeen schools were awarded the state Palmetto Gold Award for outstanding student academic performance and student growth. In addition, eleven schools earned Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards for Closing the Achievement Gap. Flowertown Elementary earned the prestigious National Blue Ribbon Award for 2013-2014. Three schools have successfully implemented the Leader in Me program to foster leadership skills for all students. One-hundred and thirty-two middle school students were named Junior Scholars. The JROTC programs at all three high schools were honored with the national Distinguished Unit Awards. The 2014 graduating classes were offered \$37,977,562 in scholarships, a district record.

Adequate funding for programs and operations continues to be a challenge for Dorchester School District Two as it ranks in the bottom five districts in per pupil expenditures. It is a challenging yet exciting time for our district as a building program is now underway to add three new elementary schools and a middle school, along with classroom additions and expansions to alleviate overcrowding. Significant progress has been made toward our vision to become a world class school district. Dorchester School District Two is leading the way, every student, every day through relationships, rigor, and relevance.
