

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REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Thank you for taking time to look over our district report card. It contains valuable information concerning our student performance indicators. The Board of Trustees and administration appreciate your involvement in and support for our schools.

Spartanburg Two continues to achieve notable academic and extracurricular successes. Our District's academic progress earned us the number one ranking among all South Carolina school districts on the state's 2013 Federal Accountability Report Card. The Class of 2014 from Chesnee and Boiling Springs high schools earned a combined \$18.5 million in scholarships. The Boiling Springs High Golf team won the 4A state championship. Several other Eagle and Bulldog athletic teams, JROTC drill teams, and both bands and orchestras also fared well in competitions. In fact, the BSHS Marching Band placed 27th in the country at the Bands of America Grand National Championships in Indianapolis.

Our classroom instruction efforts this past year have focused on several key areas: Training our teachers and writing curriculum to implement South Carolina's new state standards has resulted in higher levels of student engagement and in improving fall to spring Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) scores. We piloted 1-to-1 technology in eight middle school English Language Arts classrooms. A newly formed Technology Committee studied and explored personalized learning device options and visited other districts with 1-to-1 initiatives in place. As a result of that work, every teacher now has one version or another of an Apple iPad product as we phase in a plan to provide our students with iPad Minis. School instructional teams are determined to meet the needs of individual students through Response to Intervention (RTI) plans. Schools also have Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS) plans in place to encourage good citizenship among our students. Already, we are seeing fewer students referred for special education testing and fewer disciplinary referrals due to these two programs.

We continue to address facility needs in order to provide excellent and equitable learning environments for our students. The ten-classroom and gymnasium addition at Chesnee High is scheduled to open this fall. A plan to build three additional schools in the next five years is also underway.

Five advisory councils meet with the superintendent and staff to provide and receive information on current issues facing the schools. Members of the local business community, parents, teachers, support staff, and students advise us on ideas and initiatives.

Spartanburg School District Two is a wonderful place to live, work and learn. The presence of faith and strong families enables us to more easily educate your children. Thank you for choosing to live here and for partnering with us in this most important endeavor.
