Percent of Student SC PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

This year, Batesburg-Leesville Elementary has continued its goal to improve literacy and mathematics in our school. With the help of the Literacy Matters Program we have implemented Data Teams in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Teachers meet two times per month to look at student data, brainstorm strategies to help students improve, remediate students and collect data to see if the students have made progress using the implemented strategy. We have seen a lot of progress using Data Teams this year.

In addition, our school’s new instructional coach has worked training teachers on formative assessment and has helped teachers to implement this into their classrooms. Formative assessment is daily assessment done on students to make sure they are mastering material on a daily basis. If the teacher identifies that the student has not, he/she can intervene quickly to help the student master the material.

We are very proud that we have extremely well behaved and caring students at B-L Elementary School. This year our students sent bottled water and letters to our troops. They sent our team of students off to the Special Olympics in grand style by lining the halls with signs and cheering them on to victory. Students at BLES also raised \$5300 for Relay for Life! The Positive Behavior Intervention System has been very successful at BLES. In 2008 when PBIS first started there were 1612 school and bus referrals. In 2012-2013 we only had 236 school and bus referrals! BLES is a great place to learn!

We continue to appreciate the support of our community and PTO. This year the PTO purchased a new LED sign for our school, new soccer goals for the playground, and an extension to our playground which includes a new slide and a rock climbing wall.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target.
