

## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

West End Elementary School serves a diverse population of around 750 students in K4 through fifth grade. The school's motto is "Learning Today, Leading Tomorrow" which reflects our efforts to work together with parents, teachers, staff, and community members to provide a well-rounded program for all students in order to prepare them to be college, career and citizenship ready.

West End is in its fourth year as a Title I School-Wide Model School. The school's Title I Plan includes personnel to lower class size, instructional materials and supplies to address weaknesses in math and reading, and professional development opportunities to assist teachers as they work continuously to improve instruction. Activities to assist parents are also included in the Title I plan.

Quality instruction for all students is a focus at West End. School-level professional development activities are planned to meet this goal. Each teacher participates in a weekly professional learning community to analyze data and implement strategies to target student strengths and weaknesses. Teachers work together to plan instruction based on the South Carolina Curriculum Standards and Common Core State Standards. The results of SCPASS (South Carolina Palmetto Assessment of State Standards), MAP (Measures of Academic Progress), and classroom assessments are analyzed to determine instructional strengths and weaknesses, to develop strategies to improve instruction, and to remediate and accelerate students. West End earned 2014 Palmetto Gold recognition for overall student achievement and Palmetto Silver recognition for closing the achievement gap. West End was designated by the SC State Department of Education as a 2012-13 Title I Reward School for Performance and recognized as one of the highest performing Title I schools in the state.

West End continues to implement a school-wide positive behavior program through which students are encouraged to demonstrate the qualities of good students and are rewarded and recognized through a ticket reward system. This system reduces office referrals and has given an encouraging boost to the overall school climate. A new character education program based on Covey's 7 Habits of Healthy Kids was implemented this year.

The faculty and staff recognize the importance of building relationships with families. Special events for parents are scheduled at various times providing opportunities to attend informational workshops and family events intended to help parents as they work with their children academically and behaviorally. Workshops are also conducted off campus to better accommodate parents. Parents also participate in teacher conferences and volunteer in many different capacities. A parent resource center is stocked with materials for parent sign-out to help parents as they work with their children.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
