

We focus on the South Carolina content standards and enrich the curriculum through depth, complexity, and differentiation to ensure each student reaches his or her full potential.

Our school utilizes technology to communicate with parents and community. Our school webpages, social media, School Messenger System, and Parent Portal facilitate the sharing of information with students and parents.

Parents provide strong support to our school through their involvement in programs and activities, such as Open House, School Improvement Council, PTO, Literacy Night, and Math and Science Fun Night. We welcome parent engagement as a way to strengthen home and school communications. Students are encouraged to participate in special activities to help them develop academically, socially, and emotionally, such as the Falcon Safety Patrol, Princi-Pals, Junior Beta Club, Terrific Kids, Spelling Bee, and Life-skill Leaders. Our goal is to help our students develop as independent thinkers, effective communicators, and lifelong learners with personal responsibility and good moral character.

Academically, Mayo students received recognition for their achievements throughout the year, including the National Beta Club School of Distinction Award and induction into the Greenville Drive Reading All-Stars Hall of Fame.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
