

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

For the 2013/14 school year, Bluffton Elementary and Early Childhood Center continues to focus on academic improvement, community service and technology integration.

The staff had a strong push for Science, including the addition of a Science Lab. This led to improvements with an overall increase of 7%. After the rounds of MAP testing this year, we identified a weakness in math. We have developed plans to focus on individual student weaknesses by strand.

For technology, we have been granted permission to be a school of choice for animation, creation and design. Students will be designing apps, games and learning coding, 2D/3D and stop motion animation. This choice option will be available for 2015. Throughout this year and continuing for next year, staff will attend training and professional development in preparation for the choice.

Through our Positive Behavior Intervention community service projects, our students have donated over 600 can goods to a local food bank, reached out to our military to show support, and continued to support our local animal shelters with donated items. Our focus will be to continue to expand our projects as we work closely with the community in which we live.
