


SC PASS PERFORMANCE

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Lake View Elementary, a Title One School, was the proud winner of the Palmetto Gold Award for Academic Performance and the Palmetto Silver Award for Closing the Achievement Gap during the 2013-2014 school year. This marked the eighth straight year in a row of being named a Palmetto Gold/Silver School. In addition, under the ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System, Lake View Elementary received an A rating and was named a Title One Reward School for academic performance. This rating means that the performance at Lake View Elementary School substantially exceeds the state's expectations. These prestigious awards represent the continuous dedication and diligent work of all stakeholders.

Lake View Elementary strives daily to provide a family friendly environment and excellent customer service. The library continues to conduct Library Late Night once a month. Parents and students are invited to use the computers to conduct research or check out books together.

To ensure students have the opportunity to perform at their maximum potential for learning, free breakfast continues to be served in the classroom each morning. While students are enjoying a nutritious breakfast, the teachers are also using this time to build classroom community skills and to teach character education. The Compass Learning Program is utilized to provide an individualized plan of instruction for all students based on their MAP scores. This program ensures all students receive instruction in the needed areas to advance to the next level.
