


SC PASS PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Bell's Crossing Elementary School is a place where students learn today and lead tomorrow. The school follows the practices of Continuous Improvement/Baldrige as well as Covey's Seven Habits. The Baldrige Model of continuous improvement has students taking ownership of their learning through setting goals, tracking their progress, and communicating their growth. The Covey Model uses character strategies found in Stephen Covey's Book, Highly Effective People. The two models complement each other to make Bell's Crossing a School of Leaders.

Bell's Crossing has been recognized across the state and nation for its accomplishments. The school has received the Palmetto Gold Award. This award is attributed to the school's high academic achievement. Bell's Crossing's Guidance Program received the National RAMP Award for being a Recognized National Guidance Model Program. This past year the school was also recognized as a Safe Kids School. In the past the school has been named an Exemplary Writing School, Palmetto's Finest, Red Carpet School, and a National School of Character. Bell's Crossing continues to achieve at the highest of levels.

The school has a proven history of being a model for leadership. The students are provided leadership opportunities through Student Council, Peer Tutors, News Team, and Community Service Projects. Character education is taught throughout the school as the staff strives to educate the whole child and serve as role models for our students. Fine Arts education is promoted through school productions, Reflections Contest, and other events. The School Improvement Council is active, monitors the school goals, and serves as an advisory board with input on school improvements. The Parent Teacher Association supports the school with strong programs and financial resources.

Technology is an important aspect of Bell's Crossing Elementary. The school has ipads in each classroom, interactive whiteboards in every classroom, and devices for each student to interact with the board. Students have access to two computer labs and eight laptop carts. The school also has a virtual field trip lab. Students have opportunities to visit places like NASA, London Archives, and the Royal Botanical Gardens of Canada to enrich and expand their studies. Bell's Crossing continues to implement 21st century skills in the classroom.

Bell's Crossing strives to provide the best education for our students. Our school climate promotes a supportive learning environment for our children. We believe in educating the whole child in order for our students to soar and succeed, to grow and to lead.
