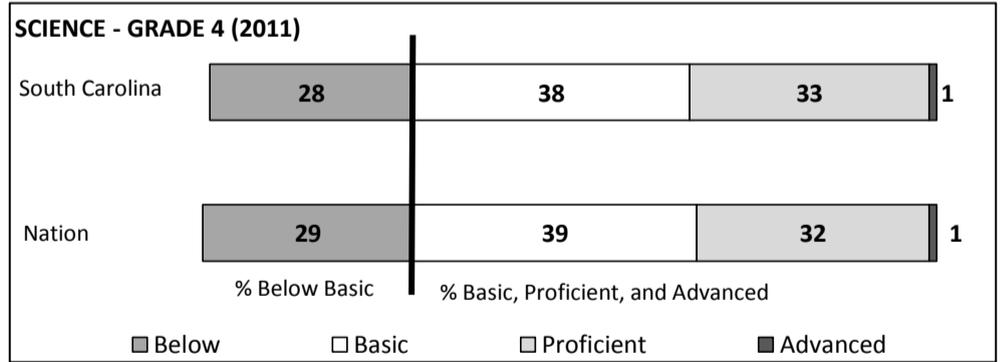
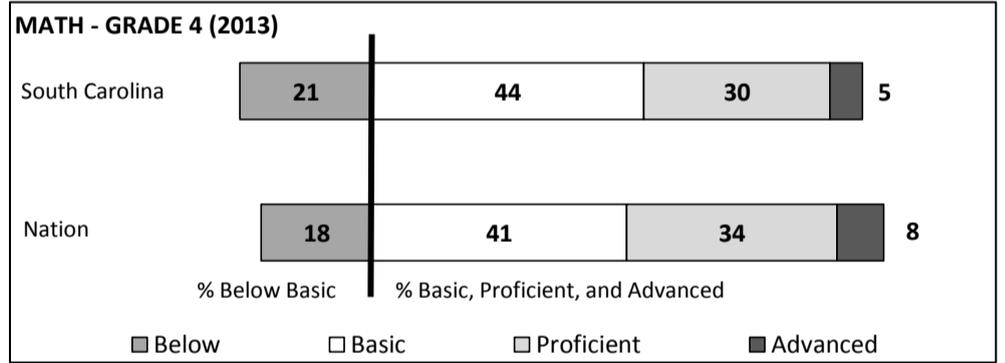
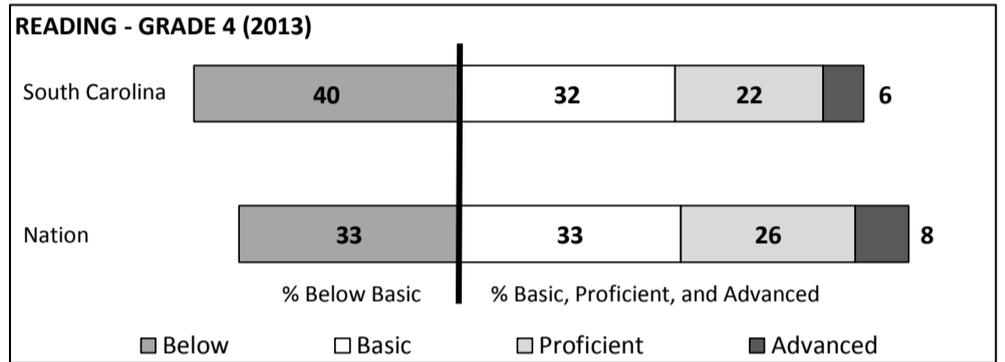
## SC PASS PERFORMANCE
