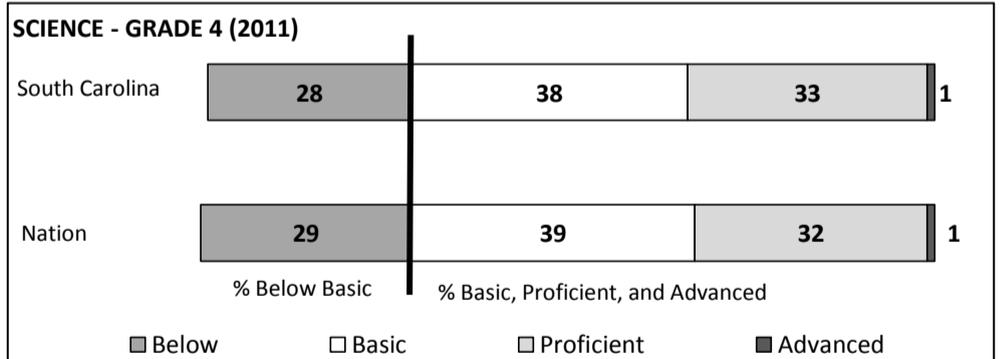
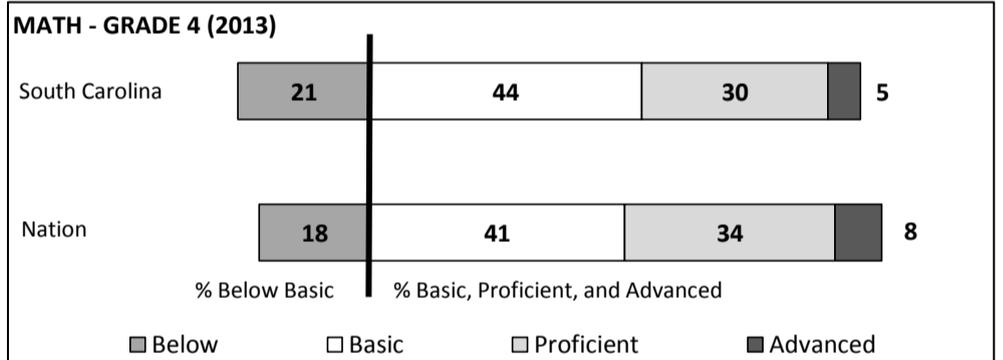

## SC PASS PERFORMANCE

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**REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL**

Gadsden Elementary, a Title One school of excellence, continues to excel as student achievement being our number one focus. During the 2013-2014 school year, Gadsden Elementary continued to demonstrate its commitment to student academic achievement and the school's National Blue Ribbon status and motto, "A Place of Great Expectations." Gadsden Elementary earned an ESEA report grade of "A" (99.5), and an Absolute rating of "Good" and a Growth rating of "Average" on the SC State Report Card. As a result of these report card grades, Gadsden Elementary earned a Palmetto Gold and Silver Award. Additionally, Gadsden Elementary earned a "Closing the Achievement Gap" award.

With an increased focus on the individual student, Gadsden Elementary continued to progress monitor students' academic performance in effort to ensure our students continued academic growth. Faculty/staff continued to allow data to inform our decision making in the classroom. Small group instruction based on students' area(s) of weakness as identified by MAP, PASS, Dominie and a number of other data sources guided our interventions, as well as classroom instructional practices in effort to continuously move our students forward.

A focus on literacy continued to be an integral part of the school as our reading teacher, as well as all classroom practitioners focused on the use of leveled texts in the classroom, Reading A-Z texts in the classroom via small groups, and Reading Recovery for our 1st grade students to build reading comprehension and fluency and thereby ensure they are ready to demonstrate these skills at the next grade level. Our reading teacher also utilizes Fountas & Pinnell's Leveled Literacy Intervention (LLI) with our Kindergarten through third students that demonstrated the need for additional assistance based on Dominie test results, this support was provided in small groups.

Our families were invited to attend our Data Gallery Night which allowed students and their family to see data displayed on data boards from various assessments which is carefully analyzed and used to guide instruction. In addition, our family and community were once again invited to become one with the school in the engagement of our students in quality, hands-on learning by attending our Family Science and Math Night. This event allowed parents to see science and math in action. Hands-on science for the family allowed students and their family to engage in science experiments, get down and dirty with "oobleck", and witness that math too can be fun, engaging and quite tasty – with a jar full of "Jelly Beans" at an estimation station. This enabled our students to get prepared for PASS while entertaining their family, peers and the community as Scientists and mathematicians.

Gadsden Elementary staff takes pride in continuing to ensure that students are soaring to meet the academic standards at each grade level by providing an environment in which students are able to continuously make gains that allow them to meet and exceed grade level expectations through classroom interventions focusing on small group instruction as it continues to be "A Place of Great Expectations".
