

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

As an authorized International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme School, Rosewood Elementary is part of a global network of schools committed to developing the personal, intellectual, emotional and social skills students need to live and work in a rapidly globalizing world. We have purposefully integrated the state and Common Core standards into six themes with thirty-six unit planners encompassing all students from K4 to grade 5. As a component of IBPYP, all students are learning French, with students in grades 3-5 following the KITE-LL daily language program. We were delighted to begin our French immersion program this year. Students in grades K and 1 had the opportunity to learn content for half the school day in French. This program will continue to grow each year until we reach 5th grade. The Learner Profile is a major component in our school day and is used for character development. The School Improvement Council focused on partnering with SC Safe Routes to Schools to conduct a safety audit and walk to school days. This study involved over 40 members of law enforcement, city and county government, faculty and parents. As a result of the study and work with partner agencies, the school has applied for a \$400,000 grant to improve walkability and biking to school.

A continued focus on climate allowed the school community to participate in Communication Forums multiple times throughout the year. These forums resulted in changes in how the school communicates with parents. A new school app was researched and developed as a direct result and will be available for the 2014 -2015 school year. The staff spent time this year conducting an International Baccalaureate Self Study which also resulted in revisions of the school Language and Assessment policies. Our summer reading initiative included targeted tutoring sessions to both accelerate and remediate students identified in our Response To Intervention model. The Exhibition theme this year was "Accessibility Promotes Opportunity." Students researched topics of interest related to the theme and found ways to take action locally. Additionally, students culminated research and action with reflective expressions of their learning which were presented at Sullivan Middle School.
