


## SC PASS PERFORMANCE

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**REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL**

Springfield Elementary School believes in our school's motto, "Racing Towards Excellence", and our adopted core values for what it means to be a Springfield Elementary COLT. These values are: Caring, Optimistic, Lifelong Learner, and Trustworthy. As a result of our focus on these core values and in our continued race towards excellence in academics, character, and community service, Springfield Elementary earned an "Excellent" Absolute Rating for the fifth year in a row and a "Good" Growth Rating on our 2013 State Report Card. We were also awarded the Palmetto Gold Award for student achievement. Springfield Elementary is fully accredited with the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) and maintains an "all clear" status with the South Carolina Department of Education.

Our focus on academics includes providing guided instruction by using the Daily 5 framework, the new Lucy Calkins writing units, and innovative math strategies for 21st century learning. For technology innovation, our school implemented the use of four iPads in each K-2 classroom and four Chromebooks with Google Docs in each 3-5 classroom to assist instruction. Our staff has been very successful in receiving grants for their classroom and school initiatives. Three grants were awarded from the Foundation of Fort Mill Schools and three grants from Donors Choose. Our School was also selected as the Carolina Panthers NFL Play 60 Super School Regional Champion and was awarded a \$10,000 health and wellness grant.

Our core values are integrated throughout the life of our school including our community service programs and extracurricular activities for students. Our Student Council led our Food Drive again this year and our students raised approximately 1000 pounds of food for the local care centers. The "Red Bag Project" was organized by our PTA. Students raised over \$4500 dollars to purchase gifts for 36 children in need during the holiday season. Student Council also led our "Pasta for Patients" campaign and raised \$6000 for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society. Springfield Elementary offers many extracurricular activities for the students. Clubs and activities include our school news program, Chorus & Drama, Environmental Club, Girls on the Run, Let Me Run, Knitting Club, Boys and Girls Book Clubs, Safety Patrol, Student Council and Talent Show.

Springfield Elementary has a very supportive PTA and School Improvement Council (SIC). Our PTA organized our Boosterthon Fundraiser, Family Nights, Book Fairs, Family Reading Night, and "Rodeo Day" School Carnival. Our SIC is instrumental in helping our staff establish goals for our school's improvement.

Our focus will continue to be on our core values of being a "COLT" and providing excellent and innovative opportunities for our students in academics, character, and community service.
