Andrews High is a comprehensive High School That Works and Title I facility that serves a widespread, rural geographic area. AHS’s schedule is flexible and affords students an opportunity to earn up to eight Carnegie units per year while focusing on a broad-based curriculum with opportunities for exploring careers and for earning college credit. To build better relationships with our students, Andrews High School employs the Capturing Kids’ Hearts initiative, which affords the staff and students an opportunity to discuss and implement a social contract in each classroom setting; it also allows teachers to teach and reinforce character development traits.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target.
