Report of Principal and School

There were many notable distinctions that were celebrated this year at Georgetown High School. For the third consecutive year, Georgetown High School received the Palmetto Gold Award for General Performance and was also recognized for Closing the Achievement Gap. The Class of 2014 earned scholarships totaling over \$2,400,00, two students graduated with South Carolina Academic Honors and five students were named Palmetto Fellows. There were also many outstanding levels of achievement in JROTC and athletics, representing an increasing level of school spirit and dedication to excellence.

Our students are provided a rigorous curriculum that includes Honors level courses, AP courses, PACE courses, and SAT/ACT preparation courses. Our strong academic program is supported by an outstanding guidance and career development staff that meets with each student multiple times each year to evaluate graduation progress, academic standing, course requests and social issues. The curriculum and instructional leaders of the school review test results to plan strategies to improve student proficiency and have implemented regularly scheduled enrichment sessions, in-class emphasis, and after-school tutorials with the focus on increasing HSAP, EOC, SAT, and ACT test results.

Georgetown High School continues to use the GHS web site, the Bulldog Byte, and a pre-recorded telephone notification system to provide important information and maintain communication with parents and the community. Our parents also have access to the Power School Parent Portal that allows parents to monitor their child's daily academic progress in each class.

Extracurricular activities and a wide array of clubs and organizations provide our students with a variety of opportunities to participate. Our athletic department consists of thirteen athletic teams and there are more than twenty-three active clubs and organizations on our campus. Student accomplishments and positive behavior are celebrated at Georgetown High School through the following mediums: Student of the Month; Career and Technology Student of the Month; The Kennel Club; and the TAG Program. These displays are located in the Joe Isaac Student Center and main hallway of the school.

We appreciate the support of our parents, community stakeholders, strong booster clubs, P.A.W.S., and the School Improvement Council. Working together, we will provide a safe environment that is conducive to quality teaching and learning and will continue our relentless pursuit toward academic excellence.

This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years. 




Reading - Grade 4 (2013)




Mathematics - Grade 4 (2013)
