**Report of Principal and School**

Brookland-Cayce High School is working diligently to produce the ideal graduate who is college and career ready and able to compete in a 21st century society. To prepare our students, BCHS is organizing into three learning academies. The Quest Academy, which targets the gifted and talented learner, completed a second successful year. i2Tech@BCHS will begin in 2014 with a cohort of 100 incoming freshmen and will focus on a STEM curricula. The BC Legacy Academy will focus on preparing the well-rounded student to be college and career ready.

BCHS received an Excellent rating from the South Carolina State Department of Education for it’s outstanding academic growth and increased the four-year graduation rate for the second year in a row. The passage rate of Advanced Placement exams rose for the second straight year along with the number of students taking AP exams. The class of 2014 had 23 honor graduates, one national merit finalist and one presidential semi-finalist. Additionally, the class of 2014 earned over \$4,000,000 in scholarships and received over \$25,000 in scholarships from the Brookland Cayce High School Education Foundation.

BCHS continued it’s collaborative best practices through the following professional learning communities: Using data to drive instructional practices, ensuring a student centered learning environment, integrating technology into daily instruction, and powerful practices that improve teaching and learning which all yielded positive results.

The Army JROTC unit was designated as an Honor Unit with Distinction for the 18th consecutive year. All of the Bearcat sports teams experienced successful seasons highlighted by our boy’s soccer team competing in the state finals and our wrestling program producing an individual state champion for the second consecutive year. The fine art programs continue to shine at BCHS with both band and chorus scoring a Superior at the state competitions. The BCHS Fine Arts department entertained the school and community with 4 major productions. The visual art students at BCHS also won many awards and recognitions at local and regional art shows.

The School Improvement Council continues to support the school through their involvement. The school climate at BCHS is consistently ranked with high markings among teachers, parents, and students created through a multitude of community support, volunteers and partnerships.


