Report of Principal and School

Welcome to the 2014-2015 school year! During 2013-2014, Batesburg-Leesville High School continued its mission of preparing students to reach their maximum potential in academics, arts, athletics, and responsible citizenship. The administration, faculty, staff, and students at Batesburg-Leesville High School are proud of the many accomplishments and gains that were achieved by the school. Many students and faculty members have been recognized for their outstanding representation of our school. The senior class of 2014 received \$1.9 million in scholarships. In addition, 46 percent of our seniors qualified for either two-year or four-year LIFE Scholarships, and four seniors received the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship.

A major highlight of the 2013-2014 school year was our designation as a Palmetto Gold recipient. This is the fourth year in a row that BLHS has received either the Gold or Silver Awards for high academic achievement. The award was won through the efforts and hard work of our school administration, faculty and staff, students, parents, the community and the support of our district and Board of Trustees.

Extracurricular activities continue to be an integral part of our school’s success. Continuing a proud tradition of excellence in athletics, the football team earned the Class 2AA Division 2 State Championship. Five varsity sports qualified for the state playoffs and many of our athletes were named to All-Region and All-Area teams. In Fine Arts, our marching band was runner-up in the 1A State Band Championship. The band also received the Outstanding Performance Award for the 11th time in twelve years. This is the highest award given by the S.C. Band Director’s Association.

Our school leadership teams have been busy planning for the upcoming school year. Along with our district-wide emphasis on literacy, we will continue to focus on increasing academic challenge and rigor through new AP course offerings and through the addition of new CATE programs such as the Project Lead the Way Biomedical program.

We look forward to a rewarding, challenging, and productive 2014-2015 school year!
