Report of Principal and School

For the 2013-2014 school year, Blythewood High School had another banner year. There have been numerous achievements in the 4A's; academics, athletics, activities and the arts.

Blythewood High is a Palmetto Gold winner in general performance and closing the achievement gap. We continue to offer innovative courses to actively engage our students. Project Lead the Way, has been successful showing an increase in student enrollment for engineering courses. The program also had their induction of the Bengals Metal Heads Robotics Team which competed in the Palmetto Regional Robotics Competition. There were two National Merit scholars and one finalist. A student was labeled an outstanding participant of the National Achievement Program. The senior class received over fifteen million dollars in scholarship money.

Blythewood High is the home of four regional champions in the sports of baseball, softball, boys' soccer and boys' golf. One student athlete is now a professional in the long drive tour. We had twelve athletes who have signed athletic scholarships. Blythewood High's athletic department continues to participate in state and regional competitions.

Students have been involved in several community endeavors including the Souper Bowl of Caring, Special Olympics, Match the Marrow, Breast Cancer Awareness, and Chef Turner Memorial. Holiday Wishes continues to be the cornerstone of supporting the community. The Blythewood High staff and students have met or exceeded all goals which support several non-profit organizations. HOSA-Future Health Professionals had ten students place in the state leadership conference. We have had seven students qualify for the Future Business Leaders of America National Leadership Competition. The JROTC Color Guard state champions reside at Blythewood High.

In addition, Blythewood High had a student receive awards in the Regional 2014 Scholastic Arts Competition. The Blue Legion Band had a successful year winning the Lower State Championship and is the state's runner up. This was the induction year for the accaBengals which was successful along with the chorus classes with their Spring Fling concert. Six students have been invited to the SC American Choral Directors Association All-State Honor Choir. The orchestra performed at the state festival and received the highest rating possible.

Blythewood High School had one of the five finalists for state teacher of the year. The principal was named Outstanding Principal of the Year by the South Carolina Association of School Librarians and South Carolina Art Education Association.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the Federal High and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target.
