




READING - GRADE 8 (2013)

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Calhoun County High School-“Offering the Total Package”

Calhoun County High School is a small rural school serving approximately 451 students in grades 9-12. The school has an 84.1% graduation rate with a 92% poverty index. Our March Toward Excellence continues as our school community continues to focus on “Offering the Total Package-Exceeding Expectations”. Calhoun County High School received several accolades this school year because of teamwork and our collaboration with parents and the community. We were recognized once again by US News and World Report as One of America’s Best High Schools. The high school received the Palmetto Gold Award and named a Reward School for performance by the South Carolina State Department of Education. We received a grade of a “B” from the ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System and an Excellent/Excellent rating on our State school report card. The dedication of the teachers, hard work of the students, and support of the community and parents continues to bring pride and positive recognition to Calhoun County High School.

Our ongoing effective staff development has insured high-quality, rigorous, and appropriate instruction for the 21st Century Learner. Initiatives that have contributed to our progress include: Individual Graduation Plans for every student, PLATO, APEX Learning, USA Test Prep, Achieve 3000, writing across the curriculum, grade level parent nights, data-driven curricula, service learning projects, SMARTboard technology, continuation of the seven period traditional schedule, credit recovery, HSAP/EOC tutorial sessions, common departmental planning periods, an award winning ROTC program, active School Improvement Council; Band Booster Club, strong partnerships with local institutions of higher education, Advisee/Advisor program, newly added Advanced Placement courses, Middle College Program (dual enrollment), and a large variety of Career and Technology course offerings.
