




READING - GRADE 8 (2013)

St. John's High School, the only public high school on John's Island, is showing in numerous ways how the district's theme, "The Victory is in the Classroom," is a part of daily life at our school. As a Palmetto Gold Title I, School Improvement Grant and Capturing Kids' Hearts School, we are continuing our emphasis on improving the quality of instruction and strengthening relationships among stakeholders. We have made great strides in bridging the gap between home and school and have progressed towards becoming a "Community School" in its truest form. Our students benefit from our comprehensive curriculum, which includes college preparatory, honors, Advanced Placement, Dual Enrollment and quality Career and Technology courses. Students are able to access courses traditionally, as well as virtually both within our district through distance education and through Edgenuity. E2020 Labs are utilized to provide students opportunities for credit recovery, remediation and acceleration. With significant emphasis on improving quality instruction, collaboration and the immersion of 1:1 iPad technology in all classes, we are proud of our progress this year. These accomplishments include a "Good" Absolute Rating and an "Excellent" Improvement Rating in 2013, the acceptance of the Class of 2014 to twenty-three different colleges and universities and the Region 6-A Championships won by our Football, Men's Basketball and Women's Track Teams.
