




READING - GRADE 8 (2013)

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Cheraw High School continues to work constantly to be the best high school in the state and make continuous improvements to assist all students in reaching their career and life goals. We are proud of our efforts and our accomplishments as we work towards the future.

Our school continues to excel in all areas of student life. Our students won three of the five academic areas represented in the Chesterfield County School District Academic Bowl championship. Four graduates qualified for Palmetto Fellows and 45 graduates qualified for a Life Scholarship. Our band and athletic teams continue to perform at a high level and compete at many state competitions. Two graduates received athletic scholarships.

Our senior class received scholarship offers exceeding 2.1 million dollars. Forty-eight percent of our seniors earned at least a 3.0 grade point average on the South Carolina Uniform Grading Scale. One of our seniors, Elaine Grant, had perfect attendance for all twelve years of school. Also, the Class of 2014 had 12 members inducted into the National Honor Society and 20 members inducted into the National Technical Honor Society.

Cheraw High School won the Palmetto Gold Award for General Performance and the Palmetto Gold Award for Closing the Achievement Gap for our efforts during the 2012 – 2013 school year. We are the only school in Chesterfield County to win two gold awards, and one of only 65 schools in the state with the distinction of two gold awards. This accomplishment should be celebrated, and we are very proud of our students, parents, and staff. In order for our school to win these awards, we must be dedicated and committed to student learning and student success. In order for our school to win these awards, we must have young people that will follow our lead and want to succeed. In order for our school to win these awards, it takes community support and plenty of stakeholder involvement. This represents the first time in school history that Cheraw High School has won two gold awards in the same school year. Also, it represents the first time since the 2004 – 2005 school year that Cheraw High School has achieved this recognition.

Each year presents its share of opportunities, challenges, and achievements. As we work with all stakeholders, we will continue to improve, get stronger, and take the lead in preparing all of our students for college, career, and life.
