




READING - GRADE 8 (2013)

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

This has been a great year at Chesterfield High School. Our students performed well academically, artistically, and athletically, demonstrating a tremendous desire to become the best students they can be. Their accomplishments include the following:

U.S. News recognized Chesterfield High School with a National Bronze Award. Seniors were offered approximately two million dollars in scholarships. Three seniors received the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship. One senior received the Academic Honors Award from the State Department of Education. One senior is a Gates Millennium Scholar. Thirty-three students were recognized as Career and Technology Completers. Fourteen students received perfect attendance for year. Our Academic Bowl Team finished first in the district competition. The band placed 8th in 2A State Championships out of 42 bands in the state, while also having several students place in the top chairs in District, Region, and USC Honor Band Clinics. Several students were selected for the All-State Band. Chesterfield Wind Ensemble earned a Superior Rating in Grade IV at SCBDA Concert Festival and earned enough points to receive the SCBDA Outstanding Performance Award. The Health Occupations classes organized a blood drive for the school. In athletics, three students received scholarships in their respective sports. We had thirty-four All-Region selections and eight All-State selections.

Teachers and students participated in the Relay for Life.

We would like to commend everyone for their hard work and dedication to making Chesterfield High an excellent school.
