




READING - GRADE 8 (2013)

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

With 49 years of history behind it, JL Mann High School, Academy of Math, Science and Technology; and Satellite Program for Orthopedically Handicapped Students continues to be a model of excellence in the Greenville County School system. Working closely with various community groups, Mann's reputation both academically and athletically has continued to rise while serving as one of the district's Magnet Program schools.

For the third consecutive year, Mann has been recognized as a Palmetto Gold School. The Class of 2013 received \$5,663,300 in higher education scholarships including the following: 30 Palmetto Fellows, two National Merit Finalists, two national Merit Letters of Commendations, 10 Sistine Scholars, and 115 AP Scholars. J. L. Mann has five Nationally Board Certified teachers. An "Excellent" rating on the School Report Card indicated gains in numerous sub-categories. Established in 2012, the Power of M program is continuing to be successful in helping to reduce the number of student failures in entry-level classes.

As a magnet school for technology, involvement in the Nationally Certified program, Project Lead the Way, allowed students the opportunity of college credits through PLTW coursework. In the fall, PTSA again sponsored the program "Challenge Day" for over 300 students, which was aimed at breaking down barriers among students and promoting diversity and acceptance. J.L. Mann's 2013 Talisman yearbook was selected the top yearbook in the state and awarded the Scroggins Award, signifying the yearbook as the best yearbook in the entire Southeast.

Patriot Pride was clearly present during 2013-2014 among the student body during Spirit Week by raising \$214,203.93 to build a Cancer Survivors Park in downtown Greenville, Challenge Day, and Mann Power transportation. J. L. Mann had a very successful year in athletics. We had a combined total of over 800 athletes spread across 37 teams. We had two state champions: girls' track and girls' lacrosse; and state runner-ups in boys' soccer and girls' soccer, cross country and swimming. J. L. Mann had 27 athletes sign to continue their athletic career at the next level, carried an average athletic GPA of 3.81 and had the Gatorade player of the year in Boys and Girls Soccer.

With all the valuable strides JL Mann has made over the years and with the continual strive towards constant improvement, the school is ready to meet the challenges of the next 50 years with innovation and enthusiasm!
