




READING - GRADE 8 (2013)

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Lugoff-Elgin High School is a Palmetto Gold recipient and has received an Excellent absolute rating and Excellent growth rating on the South Carolina School Report Card for the past two years. Our school received an "A" rating on our federal report card.

Our school was selected to host the International Anne Frank display which brought the writings of Anne Frank and the pictures of the time. The International Center helped organize events where we engaged our community in the program that included docent led tours for students, provided student workshops, and held meetings with Holocaust survivors, World War II veterans, and others with firsthand experience of human rights abuses.

The class of 2014 had 392 graduates who earned \$5,942,062 dollars in scholarships. LEHS had 131 honor graduates and 68 district academic honors medalists. Two hundred sixty (79%) of our graduates will continue their education at colleges and universities, and 46 of our graduates have enlisted in one of our military branches to serve our country.

Our collaboration with Central Carolina Technical College continues to enable us to expand our course offerings, and allows students to earn college credit while still enrolled in high school. The number of students enrolled in dual credit courses continues to grow. More than sixty students taking dual credit courses have received twelve or more college credits. Student enrollment in Advanced Placement courses continues to increase and 75% of our students passed the AP exam.

We are proud of the teachers who serve our students. This year one of teachers received district recognition. Von Duncan was selected as a Kershaw County Honor Roll Teacher of the Year. We have twenty seven teachers who have earned National Board Certification.

The SIC in conjunction with our Student Council and social studies department also hosted a political forum in the fall. We invited all of our state elected officials with a special emphasis on those representing our attendance zone. That forum was open to the public and was well attended by our students. Our Marching Band placed 7th in the state. Our Winter Guard won the Southeast Regional competition over schools from five states. A full time chorus teacher was added this school year.

Our students also raised over \$16,700 for the United Way this year. Students raised this money through activities, various sales, and collaboration with other schools in the West Wateree. Students raised over \$7,000 for our community during our Holiday HOPES program before Christmas this year. All clubs in our school adopted a charity and worked with that group to provide a special contribution for those in need during the Christmas season. Through working with the Sparkleberry Country Fair we raised over \$6000 for scholarships and classroom grants for schools in the West Wateree.
