

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Improving student achievement and improving literacy skills continue to be the major focus for Lewisville Middle School. Academic achievement and success for all students is the driving force for all instructional programs at the school. Lewisville Middle School is committed to excellence for all students.

Before-school tutoring, after school-tutoring, RTI program, and Academic Assistance classes during the school day are implemented to provide opportunities for students to be successful academically.

The school continues to use its Good Character Program and Advisor/Advisee program to develop good citizens throughout the school. The Classy Girl Club has had a positive effect on students' character and behavior.

The Pennies for Patients, Empty Stocking Fund, St. Jude Hospital Charity, Make a Difference Day, Jump Rope for Hearts, and Teen for Jeans are service learning projects in which the school participated.

Making Middle Grades Work continues to be an important school wide initiative. The Communities in Schools program is also a valuable asset to the school. The program has provided educational assistance to the students and has worked with the school to help educate all of the students.

The Parent in Action Team and The School Improvement Council continue to be valuable assets to the school. These organizations allow parents, teachers and community members the opportunity to meet and discuss concerns related to the school.

The school's business partners (Coca-Cola, Bojangles, McDonald's, China Wok, Los Magueyes, PP & G, The Wagon Wheel and David Lee and Son) continue to provide financial support and services to the school.
